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GUN CASUALTIES: ACCIDENTAL AND INTENTIONAL (AUSTRALIA, 1977)

Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research N.S.W. Department of the Attorney-General and of Justice Box 6, G.P.O., Sydney, N.S.W., 2001 Scope of Study.

Reports of casualties with firearms are reported by police as a matter of routine. This bulletin contains an analysis of these reports. Most of the work was done by Jan Houghton of this Bureau.

A total of 366 "Firearm Casualty Reports" mostly relating to incidents in 1977 in five States were analysed for this study.

Table 1 below shows the breakdown by State and type of casualty (accidental, suicide/attempted suicide, criminal), and a comparison with the number of casualties in 1974/75 (previously unpublished).

The differences between the years in the number of returns, particularly the low number from N.S.W., indicates that the forms are no longer being completed as a matter of routine whenever a firearm casualty occurs. The 42 returns for N.S.W. were sent in from 25 Police Stations only and all of these were in country areas. The numbers from Victoria and South Australia are close to those in the previous study indicating the system is still working in these States. No reports were received from Tasmania, the Northern Territory or A.C.T. in 1977.

All Reports received by the Bureau have been included in this study, although as shown in Table 2 below, a number of these casualties took place before 1977.

Thus, given the low number of returns and the wide difference in dates, the results can only be summarised rather than interpreted. If further such statistics are to be produced in the future, consideration must be given to ensuring that all returns are completed and forwarded regularly to the Bureau.

#### Results

Detailed tabulations of the data are presented in Appendix A.

Table 1 (1-20) - Accidental shootings

Table 11 (21-28) - Suicide/Attempted Suicide

Table 111 (29-40) - Intentional Shootings.

The main results were as follows:-

### Accidental Shootings

A total of 194 accidental shootings were reported, 14 fatal and 179 non-fatal (1 unknown). Further details were:-

- (i) 45% involved shooters between 15 and 24 and in 70% of all cases shooters were aged under 30.
- (ii) In 49% of cases injuries were self-inflicted;
- (iii) Most injuries in accidental shootings were to legs and arms.
- (iv) 25% of the shooters had no experience or less
  than one year's experience in handling firearms
  but over 32% had more than 5 years experience.
- (v) In 11.4% of cases either the shooter or the victim or both had used drugs or alcohol prior to the accident.
- (vi) The weapon most frequently involved (65%) was a .22 rifle; approximately 64% of weapons were described as being in new or excellent condition.
- (vii) 63% of accidents occurred in daylight hours, 40% between noon and 6.0 p.m., 62% were out of doors.
- (viii) A whole range of reasons for the cause of the casualty were given; the highest number were in the categories of getting in or out of a vehicle/riding in a vehicle (12.4%) horseplay (11.9%,) loading/unloading (8.8%), moved into line of fire (8.8%); however, in a large number of cases no reason was given or it was classed as "other".
  - (ix) In 10.8% of cases it was stated that the shooter was charged with an offence. In the majority of cases, however, no information was given on this item.

#### Suicide/Attempted Suicide

A total of 137 incidents were classified as suicide or attempted suicide; 105 (76.6%) resulted in death. Further details were:-

- (i) The number of cases was spread fairly evenly over all age groups, the highest rate (13.9%) for the 19-21 year old groups. Approximately 90% of cases involved males and 10% females.
- (ii) In 23.4% of cases it was established that alcohol or drugs were used prior to the attempt but in 39.4% of cases this was not known.

- (iii) Again a .22 rifle was the most frequent weapon used.
- (iv) The time and location were not known or not stated in a large number of cases; of the cases where time was known half were in daylight hours and half in evening, or night. Approximately 44% of suicides or attempts occurred in a building or vehicles.

#### Intentional Shootings

There were 33 intentional shootings reported, of which  $20\ \text{were fatal.}$ 

- (i) In 37% of cases the shooters were aged between 15 and 24 years; 51.4% of shooters were aged under 30 years.
- (ii) 80% of shooters were male; 60% of victims were male.
- (iii) In over 14% of cases the shooter had used alcohol or drugs prior to the shooting.
- (iv) Again a rifle was the most common weapon involved.
- (v) The shootings were spread fairly evenly throughout the day, although with few between 6 a.m. and noon. The time was not known in eight cases.
- (vi) In 16 cases there was no information about legal proceedings; of the remainder 10 shooters were charged with murder or attempted murder.

#### Future statistics

It is important to be able to say how many people are killed and injured by guns each year in Australia. From the current data it is only possible to make approximate statements.

Figures such as these have been used previously to make recommendations on firearms policy. The lethal results of intentional gun attacks in emotional situation was said to be a reason for limiting the general availability of firearms (1).

In relation to accidents, Harding (2) recommends a "policy of denying licen es to persons who cannot demonstrate that they have undergone and passed an appropriate training course designed to instil a proper sense of safety-consciousness. Such a requirement would, of course, parallel what is now standard requirement in relation to another dangerous weapon which needs to be handled with a proper sense of safety consciousness — the motor vehicle."

Several States have had some difficulty in providing the raw data, and the Bureau itself has encountered difficulties in processing the forms as they now are (See Appendix B for the current form, and Appendix C for the coding form used by the Bureau for computer processing).

It has therefore seemed desirable to attempt some re-design of the original form

- . to clarify how soon after the incident the form should be despatched to the Bureau;
- . to minimize the amount of information which is "unknown" or "not stated";
- . to facilitate rapid computer compilation of the statistics.

Work on this re-design is proceeding, including discussion with police officers and other interested parties.
