	You can nominate up to two periods, of up to a total of 2 weeks each.		
If you are unable to serve	Jury service is a rewarding responsibility. It is a fundamental part of our justice system.		
	Employers are obliged to release staff to attend jury service. Jurors can receive payment for their service.		
	However, if jury service will cause undue hardship, if you are unfit to serve, or for people in certain jobs, you can request to be removed from the jury roll. In addition, certain people are not eligible to serve on a jury under the Jury Act (NSW) 1977.
